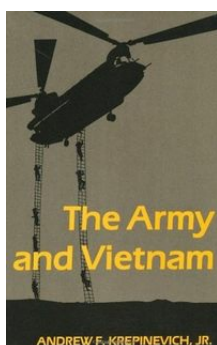


THE ARMY AND VIETNAM
